

MAHE organises workshop on 'Clinical and Translational Research for Precision Medicine'

Department of Pharmacy Practice, Manipal College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, MAHE, Manipal has organized a high-end workshop on 'Clinical and Translational Research for Precision Medicine', sponsored by DST-SERB, from July 25th to 30th at the seminar room, Department of Medical Education, MAHE.

Dr Mahadev Rao, professor and event organizer, Department of Pharmacy Practice, Manipal College of Pharmaceutical Sciences, MAHE, has received a workshop grant from the Department of Science & Technology (DST), Science & Engineering Research Board (SERB) under the Accelerate Vigyan Scheme 'KARYASHALA', Government of India, New Delhi, India.
